Current Position and Duties?

I am the Recreation Events Coordinator for St. Louis County Parks. I assist not-for-profits and other organizations host large-scale events within the St. Louis County Park system. These events include 5Ks, concerts, car shows, fundraisers, and all sorts of other activities. I also help manage the Parks Call Center. This is mainly used as a reservation line, but I could write a book on the wide range of calls that come in. Everything from "there is bison on the road preventing our car to pass through Lone Elk Park" to "I woke up and there is a peacock in my yard... is Suson Park missing theirs? If not, what do they eat? I don't want it to starve while stuck in my yard!" My favorite duty though is helping out at Winter Wonderland.
